RESOLUTION R-5452

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND AUTHORIZING THE USE AND RECEIPT OF ELECTRONIC SIGNATURES AND ELECTRONIC NOTARIZATION IN CONDUCTING CITY BUSINESS AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ADOPT ELECTRONIC SIGNATURE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES.

WHEREAS, chapter 1.80 RCW authorizes a city to utilize electronic signatures in the conduct of governmental affairs and other transactions and to establish a method and process for such use; and

WHEREAS, an electronic signature is an electronic sound, symbol, or process attached to or logically associated with a contract or other record and executed or adopted by a person with the intent to sign the record as if a signature were affixed by hand; and

WHEREAS, electronic signatures can provide a convenient, time- saving, and secure way of signing documents and can reduce environmental impacts associated with handling physical documents; and

WHEREAS, with appropriate criteria and requirements for using and accepting electronic signatures, the City can have reasonable assurance of the integrity, authenticity, and nonrepudiation of electronic documents; and

WHEREAS, the value of electronic signatures has been noticeable during the COVID-19 public health emergency, when government business has been and continues to be largely conducted via remote technologies due to the Governor's Stay Home, Stay Safe Proclamation and subsequent orders and directives; and

WHEREAS, to promote social distancing during the COVID-19 pandemic and to increase the effectiveness and efficiency of the City of Kirkland's business processes, the City intends to leverage technology solutions that comply with the Uniform Electronic Transactions Act; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to formally authorize the use and acceptance of electronic signatures and digital notarization in conducting City business.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The City Council finds it to be in the public interest to allow the use and acceptance of electronic records and electronic signatures for City business to the fullest extent allowed

 by law. The foregoing recitals are incorporated and fully made a part of this Resolution.

<u>Section 2</u>. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to adopt any administrative policies or processes necessary to implement the use and acceptance of electronic signatures by the City consistent with this Resolution and in compliance with the provisions of chapter 1.80 RCW, the Uniform Electronic Transactions Act, as presently enacted or hereafter amended.

<u>Section 3</u>. Subject to the limitations in this Resolution, City policy to be adopted by the City Manager, and state and federal law, an electronic signature may be used with the same force and effect as a signature affixed by hand.

<u>Section 4</u>. The City Council authorizes any City employee or elected official who has been granted authority to sign records on behalf of the City, and their designees, to affix electronic signatures to conduct City business and further authorizes the City to accept electronic signature from third parties, provided all of the following criteria are met:

- A. The individual is authorized to sign the document. Any individual applying an electronic signature must use their own name and must not have disclosed their password to any other individual.
- B. The signature technology has been approved by the City Manager for use in conducting City business.
- C. The appearance of the electronic signature contains, at minimum, the following:
 - 1. The identity of the individual, including all information required by the administrative policy to be adopted by the City Manager; and
 - 2. A representation of the individual's signature or acknowledgement of digital signature in-lieu of physical signature (e.g., using an "I accept" or "I agree" check box with an affirmation statement); and
 - 3. The date and time of the signature, unless the electronic signature technology is self-auditing.
- D. The individual does not provide information they know to be untrue.

<u>Section 5</u>. The use and acceptance of an electronic signature affirmed by an electronic record notary public is permitted if the notarization complies with chapter 42.45 RCW, the Revised Uniform Law on Notarial Acts, as presently enacted or hereafter amended.

<u>Section 6</u>. The use and acceptance of electronic signatures by the City of Kirkland prior to the effective date of this Resolution is hereby ratified and confirmed, provided such electronic signature is consistent with the terms of this Resolution.

<u>Section 7</u>. This Resolution in no way affects the City's ability to conduct a transaction using a physical medium and shall not be construed as a prohibition on the use of signatures affixed by hand.

<u>Section 8</u>. This Resolution shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage.
