AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO HAZARDOUS MATERIALS, DESIGNATION OF INCIDENT COMMAND AGENCY AND AMENDING SECTION 3.20.040 AND SECTION 3.20.050 OF THE KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. Section 3.20.040 of the Kirkland Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"3.20.040 Hazardous materials--Incident command agency. The Kirkland fire department is hereby designated, pursuant to the requirements of [~~Chapter 172, Washington Session Laws, 1982~~] RCW Chapter 70.136, as the hazardous materials incident command agency for the city. Said command agency is further authorized and directed to act as the hazardous materials incident command agency within the territorial limits of King County Fire District 41 at such time as the commissioners of said fire district so designate."

Section 2. Section 3.20.050 of the Kirkland Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"3.20.050 Hazardous materials--State provisions adopted by reference. The following sections of [~~Chapter 172, Washington Laws of 1982~~] RCW Chapter 70.136 are incorporated by this reference into this chapter as though fully set forth herein:

- Section 70.136.0.010--Legislative Purpose;
- Section 70.136.0.020--Definitions;
- Section 70.136.0.050--Limitation of Liability;
- Section 70.136.0.060--Hazardous Materials, Emergency Assistance Agreements;
- Section 70.136.0.070--Verbal Hazardous Materials Emergency Assistance Agreements in case of an emergency.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in force and effect five days from and after its passage by the Kirkland City Council and publication, as required by law.
