ORDINANCE 0-4787

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATED TO DEVELOPMENT FEES AND AMENDING SUBSECTIONS 21.74.030(C)(2) AND 21.74.030(H)(2) OF THE KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE.

WHEREAS, RCW 82.02.020 authorizes municipalities to collect fees for development services permits and plan reviews; and

WHEREAS, the City conducts a development fee study every three to four years, usually in conjunction with a budget development process, and current fee study will inform the development of the 2023-2024 Budget; and

WHEREAS, the 2017 fee update assumed that development activity would return to more historical levels following completion of Kirkland Urban and The Village at Totem Lake projects; and

WHEREAS, development activity continues to be robust and the 85th Station Area Plan has shown the strong potential for larger, more urbanized projects into the future; and

WHEREAS, as part of the 2021-2022 Budget process, staff included a white paper titled "Potential Revenue Options for Consideration in the 2023-2024 Budget," and one of those options is evaluating full cost recovery for development services fees; and

WHEREAS, Resolution R-5503 adopted as part of the 85th Station Area Preferred Plan Direction on December 14, 2021, provides that Council will consider amending the building permit fee schedule to create additional tiers of building permit fees for projects with total valuations over \$1,000,000; and

WHEREAS, at a February 1, 2022 study session, staff provided Council with an overview of the organization and function of development services at the City, and summarized the preliminary cost of service results from the most recent development fee update; and

WHEREAS, at the March 1, 2022 Council meeting staff provided Council with an overview of proposed adjustments to the valuation tiers for Building Permit and Fire Plan Review fee schedules that staff is looking to implement in the near-term; and

WHEREAS, revising the Building Permit Fee schedule to include additional tiers for projects with total valuations above \$1,000,000, \$5,000,000, and \$50,000,000 will adjust fees on very large projects to be more proportionate to activity; and

WHEREAS, revising Fire Prevention Plan Review Fee schedule to include tiers for projects with total valuations below \$50,000, between \$1,500,000 and \$20,000,000, and above \$20,000,000 will better distribute costs among small and large projects and meet the full cost recovery target; and

WHEREAS, the current tables in the Kirkland Municipal Code (KMC) 21.74.030 were last updated in 2014; and

WHEREAS, per KMC 21.74.015, staff have administratively adjusted development services fees annually to reflect the current published annual change in the Seattle Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Wage Earners and Clerical Workers as needed to maintain the cost recovery objectives established by the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the current development services fee schedules are published on the City's website.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Kirkland Municipal Code Subsection 21.74.030(c)(2) is amended to update building permit fees in Table 3 to read as follows:

21.74.030 General provisions for construction and permit fees.

(c) Building Permits.

(2) Building Permit Fee Schedule. Table 3 is used to calculate the building permit fee once the determination of value has been made. The permit fee is due at issuance.

PUBLICATION SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. 4787

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATED TO DEVELOPMENT FEES AND AMENDING SUBSECTIONS 21.74.030(C)(2) AND 21.74.030(H)(2) OF THE KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE.

<u>SECTION 1</u>. Amends certain development fees related to construction and permit fees.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. Provides a severability clause for the ordinance.

SECTION 3. Authorizes publication of the ordinance by summary, which summary is approved by the City Council pursuant to Section 1.08.017 Kirkland Municipal Code and establishes the effective date as July 1, 2022, which is more than five days after publication of summary.
