ORDINANCE 0-4793

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO THE CROSS KIRKLAND CORRIDOR TRAIL USE AND AMENDING KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 19.40.020.

WHEREAS, the Kirkland Municipal Code regulates hours of operations for certain City-owned facilities, among other matters; 3 and 4

WHEREAS, the Cross Kirkland Corridor is a City-owned regional transportation facility that traverses the city and passes through many residential neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, Kirkland Municipal Code currently limits use of the Cross Kirkland Corridor to "daytime hours only;" and

WHEREAS, the City desires to give greater specificity to the 12 operating hours of the Cross Kirkland Corridor; and 13

15 WHEREAS, people commuting to and from work and school frequently do so during pre-dawn and post-dusk hours, especially 16 during the autumn and winter seasons, and the City wishes to 17 accommodate them; 18

19 20 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland do ordain as follows: 21 22

<u>Section 1</u>. Section 19.40.020 of the Kirkland Municipal 23 Code is amended to read as follows: 24 25

No person shall travel on the trail at a speed greater than 27 (a) what is reasonable and prudent under the conditions and having 28 regard for actual and potential hazards. In every event, speed 29 shall be controlled as may be necessary to avoid colliding with 30 others who are complying with the law and using reasonable care. 31 Travel at speeds in excess of fifteen miles per hour shall result in 32 a prima facie presumption that the person violated this section. 33

(b) No person shall travel on the trail in a negligent manner. For 34 the purposes of this section, "travel on the trail in a negligent manner" shall be construed to mean any form of travel on the trail 35 36 37 in a manner likely to endanger any persons or property.

For the purposes of this section "travel" shall be construed 38 (C) to include all forms of movement or transportation on the trail, 39 including but not limited to foot, bicycle, skateboard and roller 40 41 skates.

Every person traveling on the trail shall obey the instructions 42 (d) of any official traffic control device applicable thereto unless 43 44 otherwise directed by a police officer.

(e) No motorized vehicles shall be allowed on Kirkland trails. For
the purpose of this section, "motorized vehicles" means any form
of transportation powered by an internal combustion or electric
motor.

This includes but is not limited to automobiles, golf carts, mopeds,
motor-driven cycles, motorized foot scooters, and motorcycles.
This section shall not apply to wheelchairs powered by electric
motors, electric-assisted bicycles or authorized maintenance,
police, fire or emergency vehicles.

Trails on the CKC are open to all nonmotorized users unless 54 (f) otherwise designated and posted. Pedestrians and bicyclists are 55 permitted on all maintained soft surface trails unless otherwise 56 posted and designated. Horseback riding and equestrians are 57 prohibited. Trail restrictions may be posted at appropriate 58 locations along the CKC. Trail use designations and restrictions may be based on the CKC master plan, resource conservation, 59 60 trail user conflicts, maintenance issues, and safety hazards. 61

62 (g) Every person who shall use or travel on the trail shall obey 63 the trail user code of conduct.

64 (h) Trail User Code of Conduct.

(1) Using the Trail. Every person using the trail shall stay as
near to the right side of the trail as is safe, excepting those
movements necessary to prepare to make or make turning
movements, or while overtaking and passing another user moving
in the same direction.

(2) Regard for Other Trail Users. Every user shall exercise due
 care and caution to avoid colliding with any other trail user. All
 users shall travel in a consistent and predictable manner.

(3) Groups on Trail. No group of trail users, including their
 animal(s), shall occupy more than one-half of the trail as
 measured from the right side, so as to impede the normal and
 reasonable movement of trail users.

Audible Signal When Passing. Every user shall give an 77 (4) audible warning signal before passing another trail user. The 78 signal must be produced in such a manner as to allow adequate 79 time for response. The signal may be given by voice, bell or horn. 80 81 (5) Overtaking Trail Users on the Left. Any trail user overtaking another trail user proceeding in the same direction shall pass to 82 the left of such overtaken user at a safe distance, and shall stay 83 to the left until safely clear of the overtaken user. 84

(6) Entering and Crossing Trail. Trail users entering or crossing the trail at uncontrolled points shall yield to traffic on the trail.

(7) Lights on Trail Users. All bicyclists using the trail from onehalf hour before sunset to one-half hour after sunrise shall equip their bicycles with a headlight visible five hundred feet to the front, and a red or amber light visible five hundred feet to the rear.

(8) Regard for Adjacent Property Owners. Trail users should
 respect private lands adjacent to the trails and should stay on
 trails to avoid trespassing on or interfering with adjacent private
 property.

96 (9) Péts on Leash. Ali pets on trails shall be kept on leash and 97 under the control of the pet's owner or caretaker. The pet's owner 98 or caretaker shall remove and properly dispose of all animal
 99 droppings left by the pet.

100 (10) Hours of Use. Trail use shall be limited to daylight hours 101 only <u>5 a.m. to 11 p.m</u>.

103 <u>Section 2</u>. If any provision of this ordinance or its 104 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 105 remainder of the ordinance or the application of the provision to 106 other persons or circumstances is not affected.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in force and effect five
 days from and after its passage by the Kirkland City Council and
 publication pursuant to Section 1.08.017, Kirkland Municipal Code
 in the summary form attached to the original of this ordinance and
 by this reference approved by the City Council.

SECTION 1. Amends Kirkland Municipal Code Section 19.40. 020 related to the Cross Kirkland Corridor Trail hours of use.

> SECTION 2. Provides a severability clause for the ordinance.

SECTION 3. Authorizes publication of the ordinance by summary, which summary is approved by the City Council pursuant to Section 1.08.017 Kirkland Municipal Code and establishes the effective date as five days after publication of summary.
