

RESOLUTION R-5557

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND ALLOCATING THE CITY'S PORTION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FUNDS FOR 2023.

1 WHEREAS, on May 20, 2014, the City Council authorized
2 the City of Kirkland's ("City") participation in the King County
3 Community Development Block Grant and HOME Investment
4 Partnerships Program (CDBG/HOME) Consortium as a Joint
5 Agreement City and the City entered into an Interlocal Agreement
6 with King County for that purpose; and
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8 WHEREAS, on July 21, 2020, the City Council extended its
9 Interlocal Agreement with King County as a Joint Agreement City
10 through 2023; and
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12 WHEREAS, as a Joint Agreement City, the City receives
13 funds in support of programs and projects that directly benefit our
14 community, including but not limited to home repair, affordable
15 housing, community facilities, public infrastructure, and human
16 services; and
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18 WHEREAS, as part of the Interlocal Agreement with King
19 County, the City must develop a plan for allocating its portion of
20 the CDBG funds each year; and
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22 WHEREAS, toward developing such a plan, the City's
23 Human Services Commission held a public hearing on August 23,
24 2022, at which time the Commission provided an opportunity for
25 the public to comment on recommendations for the plan, which
26 recommendations are now being forwarded to the Council.
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28 NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the
29 City of Kirkland as follows:
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31 Section 1. The recommendations of the Human Services
32 Commission are accepted and approved by the City Council.
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34 Section 2. Based on estimates provided by the United
35 States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD),
36 the City intends to allocate 2023 funds as follows:
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- 38 (a) \$161,783 of Capital Projects funds to A Regional
39 Coalition for Housing Trust Fund for affordable housing
40 projects;
41 (b) \$41,785 of Public Services funds to Congregations for
42 the Homeless to support its 24/7/365 enhanced
43 emergency shelter for men experiencing homelessness;
44 and

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(c) \$40,285 of Planning & Administration funds to support the City's administration of the CDBG program.

Section 3. In the event the funding level provided by HUD is more or less than estimated, the above projects, services and administration should receive proportionate increases or decreases based upon the final distribution amount.
