AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO AMENDING SECTION 3.80.110 OF THE KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING CITY OF KIRKLAND HOLIDAYS.

WHEREAS, on June 19, 1865, more than two years after President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation, the news that slavery had been abolished in the Confederate states and that all enslaved people in the Confederacy had been freed was announced in Galveston, Texas, the last state of the Confederacy that maintained institutional slavery; and

WHEREAS, June 19, recognized as "Juneteenth," has been celebrated to commemorate the end of slavery in practice in the United States and the contributions of Americans of African descent to society; and

WHEREAS, currently, Juneteenth commemorates African American freedom and emphasizes education and achievement; and

WHEREAS, the federal government designated Juneteenth as a national holiday for federal employees in 2021, and during the 2021 regular session, the Washington State Legislature passed substitute house bill 1016 establishing Juneteenth as a paid holiday for State employees beginning in 2022, and;

WHEREAS, the establishment of Juneteenth as a paid holiday for City of Kirkland employees is a significant way that the City can embrace efforts to address institutional racism and strengthen diversity, equity, and inclusion in City policies and programs; and

WHEREAS, designating Juneteenth as a City holiday supports the City's Resolution R-5434 related to examining and dismantling institutional and structural racism in Kirkland and Resolution R-5548 which committed funding for this purpose, including writing the City's first Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Belonging Roadmap.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 3.80.110 of the Kirkland Municipal Code, and the corresponding portions of Ordinance O-3905 § 14 (2003), is amended to read as follows, with new text shown in <a href="underline">underline</a> and deleted text shown in <a href="strikethrough">strikethrough</a>:

## 3.80.110 Holidays.

(a) Holiday Schedule. Regular full-time employees are granted the following holidays, and other such days as the city council may fix, without reduction in pay. Regular part-time employees and temporary employees that will or have exceeded one thousand and forty hours

within six months of hire shall receive these holidays and other such days as the city council may fix at a rate proportionate to the number of hours worked per month, without reduction in pay.

In selecting the floating holiday the employee's choice will be granted; provided, that prior approval is given by the immediate supervisor and provided the number of employees selecting a particular day off does not prevent a department or office from providing efficient public service. The floating holiday must be taken during the calendar year or entitlement to the day will be forfeited. New employees must be employed a minimum of six consecutive months to be eligible to take a floating holiday.

(b) Holidays Occurring on Weekends. Any regular holiday which falls on a Saturday shall be observed on the preceding Friday and any regular holiday which falls on a Sunday shall be observed on the following Monday.

(c) Worked Holidays. When a regular employee other than uniformed personnel works on a holiday, he/she will be granted one other day of vacation with full pay for each holiday worked. Such vacation days shall be approved in the best interests of the city.

Section 2. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the

ordinance or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.

<u>Section 3</u>. This ordinance shall be in force and effect five days from and after its passage by the Kirkland City Council and publication pursuant to Section 1.08.017, Kirkland Municipal Code in the summary form attached to the original of this ordinance and by this reference approved by the City Council.

## PUBLICATION SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. 4850

<u>SECTION 1</u>. Amends Kirkland Municipal Code Section 3.80.110 related to the City of Kirkland holiday schedule.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. Provides a severability clause for the ordinance.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. Authorizes publication of the ordinance by summary pursuant to KMC 1.08.017 and establishes the effective date as five days after publication of summary.
