

RESOLUTION R-5603

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND ALLOCATING THE CITY'S PORTION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FUNDS FOR 2024.

1 WHEREAS, on May 20, 2014, the City Council authorized the
2 City of Kirkland's ("City") participation in the King County Community
3 Development Block Grant and HOME Investment Partnerships Program
4 (CDBG/HOME) Consortium as a Joint Agreement City and the City
5 entered into an Interlocal Agreement with King County for that purpose;
6 and

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8 WHEREAS, on September 5, 2023, the City Council approved
9 extending its Interlocal Agreement with King County as a Joint
10 Agreement City through 2026; and

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12 WHEREAS, as a Joint Agreement City, the City receives funds
13 in support of programs and projects that directly benefit our community,
14 including but not limited to home repair, affordable housing, community
15 facilities, public infrastructure, and human services; and

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17 WHEREAS, as part of the Interlocal Agreement with King
18 County, the City must develop a plan for allocating its portion of the
19 CDBG funds each year; and

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21 WHEREAS, toward developing such a plan, the City's Human
22 Services Commission held a public hearing on August 22, 2023, at
23 which time the Commission provided an opportunity for the public to
24 comment on recommendations for the plan, which recommendations
25 are now being forwarded to the Council.

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27 NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the
28 City of Kirkland as follows:

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30 Section 1. The recommendations of the Human Services
31 Commission are accepted and approved by the City Council.


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33 Section 2. Based on estimates provided by the United States
34 Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), the City intends
35 to allocate 2024 funds as follows:

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37 (a) \$193,227 of Capital Projects funds to A Regional Coalition
38 for Housing Trust Fund for affordable housing projects;
39 (b) \$48,248 of Public Services funds to Congregations for the
40 Homeless to support its 24/7/365 enhanced emergency shelter
41 for men experiencing homelessness; and
42 (c) \$43,306 of Planning & Administration funds to support the
43 City's administration of the CDBG program.

44 Section 3. In the event the funding level provided by HUD is
45 more or less than estimated, the above projects, services and
46 administration should receive proportionate increases or decreases
47 based upon the final distribution amount.
