

RESOLUTION R-5605

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND AUTHORIZING APPLICATION FOR FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR LOCAL PARK MAINTENANCE GRANT PROGRAM PROJECT TO THE WASHINGTON STATE RECREATION AND CONSERVATION OFFICE AS PROVIDED IN CHAPTER 79A.25 REVISED CODE OF WASHINGTON AND WASHINGTON ADMINISTRATIVE CODE TITLE 286, AND SUBSEQUENT LEGISLATIVE ACTION.

1 WHEREAS, the City of Kirkland is seeking funding assistance for
2 a for Local Park Maintenance (LPM) funds (Tier 1 – Multi-Sites); and
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4 WHEREAS, the City of Kirkland has approved a Parks Recreation
5 and Open Space Plan which includes recommendations on sport court
6 maintenance; and
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8 WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Local Park Maintenance
9 Grant program, as provided in Chapter 79A.25 RCW and Washington
10 Administrative Code Title 286, state grant assistance is requested to aid
11 in financing the cost of facility maintenance; and
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13 WHEREAS, the City Council considers it in the best public interest
14 to complete the multi-site sport court maintenance described in the
15 funding assistance application.

17 NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City
18 of Kirkland as follows:
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20 Section 1. The Director of Parks and Community Services is
21 authorized to make formal application to the Recreation and Conservation
22 Office for grant assistance.

24 Section 2. Any grant assistance received will be used for direct
25 costs associated with implementation of the project referenced above.
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27 Section 3. The City certifies that that there are no required
28 matching funds.
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30 Section 4. The City acknowledges that the grant assistance, if
31 approved, will be paid on a reimbursement basis, meaning the City will
32 only request payment from the Recreation and Conservation Office after
33 eligible and allowable costs have been incurred and payment remitted to
34 the City's vendors, and that the Recreation and Conservation Office will
35 hold retainage until the project is deemed complete.
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37 Section 5. The City acknowledges that any facility developed
38 through grant assistance from the Recreation Conservation Funding
39 Board must be reasonably maintained and made available to the general
40 public at reasonable hours and times of the year according to the type of


41 area or facility unless other restrictions have been agreed to by the
42 Recreation and Conservation Office Director or the Recreation and
43 Conservation Funding Board.

45 Section 6. The City acknowledges that any facility developed with
46 grant assistance from the Recreation and Conservation Funding Board
47 must be dedicated for public outdoor recreation purposes, and be retained
48 and maintained for such use for perpetuity unless otherwise provided and
49 agreed to by the City and the Recreation and Conservation Funding
50 Board.

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52 Section 7. This Resolution shall become part of a formal
53 application to the Recreation and Conservation Office for grant
54 assistance.


