

ORDINANCE O-4868

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO ESTABLISHING A UNIVERSAL LOW-INCOME RELIEF PROGRAM, CREATING A NEW CHAPTER OF THE KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE TO CODIFY THE UNIVERSAL LOW-INCOME RELIEF PROGRAM, AND REPEALING VARIOUS CODE PROVISIONS WITH MORE LIMITED LOW-INCOME RELIEF PROGRAMS.

1 WHEREAS, the Washington State Constitution, Article VII,
2 Section 7, permits "support of the poor and infirm" by local governments;
3 and
4

5 WHEREAS, since 1989, the City has operated a utility discount
6 program that is open to low-income, single-family residential customers
7 who are 62 years or older, blind, disabled, or on home kidney dialysis,
8 but the program requires the person to be the bill holder, which prevents
9 many residents who rent their residence from benefiting from the
10 program; and
11

12 WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that low-income
13 residents in particular are impacted by inflation, rising utility rates, and
14 other increasing costs of living in the city, and further recognizes that an
15 individual working at minimum wage currently needs to work 120 hours
16 a week to afford a one-bedroom apartment on the Eastside; and
17

18 WHEREAS, the City Council wants to continue its efforts to
19 support low-income residents who call Kirkland home and, to that end,
20 desires to create a universal low-income relief program that discounts,
21 reduces, or provides rebates for City utilities rates and from various City
22 fees ensuring safeguards are in place to support a diverse and equitable
23 community; and
24

25 WHEREAS, the City Council desires to have this new universal
26 low-income relief program accessible for those who are eligible
27 regardless of age, race, ethnicity, gender, marital status, education,
28 employment, housing type, or disability status.
29

30 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland do
31 ordain as follows:
32

33 Section 1. The City Council hereby establishes a universal low-
34 income relief program for those rates and fees charged and imposed
35 beginning January 1, 2024. A new chapter, entitled "Low-Income Relief
36 Program," shall be codified and added to Title 5 of the Kirkland Municipal
37 Code (KMC) as chapter 5.90.
38

39 Section 2. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC,
40 to be codified as KMC 5.90.010, to read as follows:
41

42 **5.90.010 Kirkland Universal Low-Income Relief Program**

43

44 The purpose of the City of Kirkland Universal Low-Income Relief
45 Program is to promote more affordable living in the city and create a
46 more equitable community through reductions of or rebates for certain
47 City fees and charges.

48

49 Section 3. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC,
50 to be codified as KMC 5.90.020, to read as follows:

52 **5.90.020 Definitions**

53

54 For the purposes of this chapter, the following definitions apply:

55

56 "Director" means the Director of the Finance and Administration
57 Department.

58

59 "Low-income household" means one or more adults and their
60 dependents whose gross income does not exceed 80 percent of the
61 median household income for King County, adjusted for household size.

62

63 "Low-income resident" means a person residing within the city of
64 Kirkland whose gross income does not exceed 80 percent of the median
65 household income for King County.

66

67 Section 4. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC,
68 to be codified as KMC 5.90.030, to read as follows:

69

70 **5.90.030 Administration.**

71

72 (a) The finance and administration department shall be responsible for
73 implementing this chapter and the universal low-income relief
74 program.

75

76 (b) The Director shall have the authority to issue such rules and
77 administrative procedures as may be necessary to implement this
chapter.

78

79 Section 5. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC,
80 to be codified as KMC 5.90.040, to read as follows:

81

82 **5.90.040 Qualification.**

83

84 (a) All applications for participation in any low-income relief program or
85 claims for rebate under this chapter shall be submitted on a form
86 approved by the Director and accompanied by that documentation
87 required by the Director to establish eligibility. Applications or
88 claims for rebate under this chapter must include a certification by
89 the applicant or claimant that, under the penalty of perjury, all
information provided in the application or claim is true and correct.

90 (b) The Director may require the applicant or claimant to provide those
 91 documents the Director deems necessary to establish proper proof
 92 of income level, which may include but not be limited to copies of
 93 their federal income tax return for the previous year, Social
 94 Security benefits statement or award letter, or similar
 95 documentation.

96 (c) The city, in its discretion, may require any applicant or claimant
 97 paying a discounted rate or receiving a rebate under this chapter to
 98 produce updated proof of qualification at any time during the period
 99 of qualification.

100 (d) A qualified low-income household paying a discounted low-income
 101 relief rate or a qualified low-income resident receiving a low-
 102 income relief rebate must promptly notify the City if the applicant or
 103 claimant no longer meets the criteria for receiving the qualified low-
 104 income discount rate or rebate.

105
 106 Section 6. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC,
 107 to be codified as KMC 5.90.050, to read as follows:

108
 109 **5.90.050 Discounted utility rates and fees.**

110
 111 (a) Qualified low-income households residing in a single-family
 112 residential unit that are directly billed by the City as a customer will
 113 be charged the following water, sewer, and garage rates user
 114 rates:

115 (1) Water. Fifty percent of the basic charge (includes two
 116 hundred cubic feet of water consumed) as set forth in
 117 Table 15.24.020, and the full amount of the water
 118 consumption charge as set forth in Table 15.24.024 of
 119 the Kirkland Municipal Code.

120 (2) Sewer. Seventy-five percent of the single-family
 121 residential rate set forth in Table 15.24.070 of the
 122 Kirkland Municipal Code.

123 (3) Solid Waste. Sixty percent of the rate set forth in
 124 KMC 16.12.030(1)(A).

125 (b) Qualified low-income households residing in a multi-family
 126 residential unit with utility costs itemized in their rental agreement
 127 or rental bill are eligible to receive a rebate for applicable City-
 128 owned utilities based on the utility payment amounts specified in
 129 their rental agreement or bill.

130 (c) Qualified low-income households residing in a multi-family
 131 residential unit with utility costs included in the rental amount are

132 eligible to receive a rebate for applicable City-owned utilities based
 133 on the residential unit size in accordance with the following table:

139 (d) All claims for rebate under this section must be submitted within six
 140 months following the month for which the rebate is requested. A
 141 qualified low-income household may submit multiple rebate
 142 requests together.

143
 144 Section 7. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC,
 145 to be codified as KMC 5.90.060, to read as follows:

146
 147 **5.90.060 Discounted pet license rates and fees.**

148 (a) The pet license fee established by KMC 8.09.130 charged to a
 149 qualified low-income resident for an altered pet shall be discounted
 150 by the full cost of the license.

151 (b) The pet license fee established by KMC 8.09.130 charged to a
 152 qualified low-income resident for an unaltered pet shall be
 153 discounted up to the cost of an altered pet license fee.

154 (c) The transfer license fee established by KMC 8.09.130 charged to a
 155 qualified low-income resident shall be discounted up to the cost of
 156 an altered pet license fee.

157
 158 Section 8. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC,
 159 to be codified as KMC 5.90.070, to read as follows:

160
 161 **5.90.070 Vehicle fee rebate.**

162
 163 (a) A qualified low-income resident may request a fixed amount rebate
 164 of the city-imposed vehicle fee established by Ordinance O-4834,
 165 or a successor ordinance under chapter 19.22 KMC, by submitting
 166 an application at the specified time and must have personally paid
 167 the city-imposed vehicle fee.

168
 169 (b) The fixed amount rebate shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00)

170
 171 (c) All claims for rebate must be filed within the vehicle license period
 172 for which the rebate is requested.

173

174 (d) Such rebates will not be paid from any funds that would be in
175 violation of chapter 82.80 RCW.

176
177 Section 9. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC,
178 to be codified as KMC 5.90.080, to read as follows:
179

180 **5.90.080 Discounted business license rates and fees.**

181
182 The basic license fee for the annual business license issued under
183 chapter 7.02 KMC to be charged to a qualified low-income resident
184 shall be fifty percent of the basic license fee established by KMC
185 7.02.120. No discount shall be applied to the applicable revenue
186 generating regulatory license fee.
187

188 Section 10. KMC 15.24.100, and the corresponding portions of
189 Ordinance O-3766 § 5 (2000) and its predecessors, is hereby repealed.
190

191 Section 11. KMC 16.12.025, and the corresponding portions of
192 Ordinance O-3771 § 1 (2000) and its predecessors, is hereby repealed.
193

194 Section 12. If any provision of this ordinance or its application
195 to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the
196 ordinance or the application of the provision to other persons or
197 circumstances is not affected.
198

199 Section 13. This ordinance shall be in force and effect on
200 January 1, 2024, after its passage by the Kirkland City Council and
201 publication, as required by law.



OF ORDINANCE NO. 4868

1 SECTION 1. Establishes a universal low-income relief
2 program beginning January 1, 2024, adding a new Chapter 5.90 to the
3 Kirkland Municipal Code ("KMC").
4

5 SECTION 2. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.010 entitled
6 "Kirkland Universal Low-Income Relief Program."
7

8 SECTION 3. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.020 related to
9 definitions for the Chapter.
10

11 SECTION 4. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.030 related to the
12 administration of the program.
13

14 SECTION 5. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.040 related to
15 qualifications for the program.
16

17 SECTION 6. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.050 related to the
18 discounted utility rates and fees.
19

20 SECTION 7. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.060 related to the
21 discounted pet license rates and fees.
22

23 SECTION 8. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.070 related to a
24 vehicle fee rebate.
25

26 SECTION 9. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.080 related to
27 discounted business license rates and fees.
28

29 SECTION 10. Repeals KMC Section 15.24.100.
30

31 SECTION 11. Repeals KMC Section 16.12.025.
32

33 SECTION 12. Provides a severability clause for the ordinance.
34

35 SECTION 13. Authorizes publication of the ordinance by
36 summary, which summary is approved by the City Council pursuant to
37 Section 1.08.017 Kirkland Municipal Code and establishes the effective
38 date as five days after publication of summary.
39

41 any person upon request made to the City Clerk for the City of Kirkland.
42 The Ordinance was passed by the Kirkland City Council at its meeting
43 on the 12th day of December, 2023.
