

RESOLUTION R-5622

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND SETTING POLICY PRINCIPLES FOR PRIORITIZATION IN THE 2025-2030 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM.

1 WHEREAS, the Transportation Element of the Kirkland  
2 Comprehensive Plan represents a collaboration between community  
3 members, staff and the City Council to develop a long-term vision for  
4 the City of Kirkland's growth over the next 20 years; and

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6 WHEREAS, the City Council has adopted eleven goals for the  
7 City that articulate key policies and service priorities, and guide the  
8 allocation of resources for Kirkland through the budget and capital  
9 improvement programs; and

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11 WHEREAS, the City Council desires to retain a high quality of  
12 life in Kirkland, including realizing the new goods, services, housing  
13 opportunities and economic development potential that comes from  
14 growth in the community; and

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16 WHEREAS, the City Work Program is a fundamental tool for the  
17 sustainable allocation of resources to meet the needs and expectations  
18 of Kirkland community members; and

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20 WHEREAS, the 2025-2030 Capital Improvements Plan provides  
21 an opportunity for public investments over the next six years that  
22 continue the City's progress towards meeting these goals.

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24 NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the  
25 City of Kirkland as follows:

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27 Section 1. The Kirkland City Council endorses development of  
28 a 2025-2030 Capital Improvement Program to maximize the benefit to  
29 the community within the given level of funding prioritized according to  
30 the following principles:


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32 a. Complete capital projects from the 2023-2024 City Work Plan,  
33 including the Safer Routes to School Plans, Active  
34 Transportation Plan and Vision Zero priority projects funded by  
35 the Transportation Benefit District and related revenues.  
36 b. Complete public safety capital investments that implement  
37 voter-approved 2018 Police Proposition 1 and 2020 Fire  
38 Proposition 1.  
39 c. Identify and complete utility and transportation projects  
40 necessary to ensure the success of WSDOT and Sound Transit  
41 investments in I-405 and Kirkland.  
42 d. Complete transportation capacity projects necessary to achieve  
43 the City's land-use and sustainability goals in growing areas.

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- e. Invest in transportation projects according to the priorities contained in the 2024 Transportation Strategic Plan and other adopted transportation planning documents.
- f. Invest in parks projects that maintain current facilities and that increase active recreation opportunities throughout the City to meet the needs of a growing population.
- g. Invest in water, sewer, and stormwater projects according to the priorities and regulatory requirements contained in the adopted utility strategic plans.
- h. Invest in sustainable and proactive plans to maintain and replace critical city and facility infrastructure.
- i. Create measurable progress towards achieving the City Council's eleven goals.
