ORDINANCE O-4880

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO COMBINED SCHOOL SPEED ZONES AND ENFORCEMENT PERIODS FOR AUTOMATED TRAFFIC SAFETY CAMERAS IN SCHOOL SPEED ZONES.

1 WHEREAS, state law authorizes cities to create school or 2 playground speed zones where vehicles must travel no more than 3 twenty miles per hour; and 4

WHEREAS, Kirkland has established school speed zones throughout the city, including in areas where there are multiple overlapping school and school crosswalk speed zones, such as in the 8 Finn Hill and Kingsgate neighborhoods; and 9

10 WHEREAS, given the overlap between the school and school 11 crosswalk speed zones in these particular areas and the signage 12 requirements that accompany the beginning and ending of each zone 13 individually, these overlapping zones are appropriately considered 14 combined school speed zones to avoid driver confusion for signage and 15 enforcement purposes; and 16

17 WHEREAS, Council now desires to adopt a formal regulation 18 designating these overlapping combined school and school crosswalk 19 zones to clearly reference and support these areas; and 20

21 WHEREAS, the City Council has previously authorized the use 22 of automated traffic safety cameras for the detection of and issuance of 23 infractions for traffic violations in school speed zones in order to achieve 24 lower vehicle speeds in school zones and improve safety for school 25 children, their families, and their caregivers; and 26

27 WHEREAS, the time periods for automated enforcement that are 28 currently established by City code do not clearly account for combined 29 school zones, since the start and end times vary from school to school; 30 and 31

32 WHEREAS, increased compliance with the 20-mph school 33 speed limit reduces the exposure of our most vulnerable road, sidewalk, 34 and bike path users to crashes that are more likely to result in serious 35 injuries or fatalities; and 36

37 WHEREAS, in addition to improved safety, lower vehicle speeds 38 provide a more comfortable and lower stress environment for people 39 walking, rolling, and bicycling to school and, therefore, encourage more 40 transportation mode choices, in alignment with the City Council's goals 41 of Balanced Transportation and a Sustainable Environment; and 42

43 WHEREAS, to support the goal of Kirkland's automated 44 enforcement program to improve safety for vulnerable users of all travel 45 modes traveling to and from school, the City Council desires to modify 46 the enforcement period to account for combined school zones.

48 NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland do 49 ordain as follows: 50 51 Section 1. A new section, to be titled "School and playaround 52 speed zones," is added to chapter 12.04 of the Kirkland Municipal Code 53 (KMC), to be codified as KMC 12.04.060: 54 55 12.04.060 School and playground speed zones. 56 57 (a) The speed limit in school and playground speed zones shall be 20 58 miles per hour when appropriate signs indicate or when flashing 59 beacons are active, as applicable. School and playground speed zones 60 shall be 300 feet, or as close as reasonably possible given the physical 61 constraints of placing signage, but with marked crosswalks no less than 62 300 feet, in either direction from a marked school or playground 63 crosswalk or from the border of a school or playground property. 64 Combined school zones must be approved by the Council. The following 65 combined school zones are authorized: 66 67 (1) Approximately 1,580 feet along 132nd Avenue NE from just 68 south of NE 143rd St. to just north of NE 138th Pl. 69 70 (2) Approximately 4,800 feet along 84th Avenue NE from just 71 south of NE 141st St. to NE 126th Pl. 72 73 (b) The school and playground speed zones shall be extended beyond 74 the distances specified in subsection (a) if a greater distance is required 75 by RCW 46.61.440 or WAC 468-95-330. 76 77 Section 2. KMC 12.14.010, and the corresponding portions of 78 Ordinance O-4681 § 1 (2019), is amended to read as follows, with new 79 text shown in <u>underline</u> and deleted text shown in strikethrough: 80 81 12.14.010 Authorized use of automated traffic safety cameras. 82 83 (a) Law enforcement officers of the city of Kirkland and persons 84 commissioned by the Kirkland police department are authorized to use 85 automated traffic safety cameras and related automated systems to 86 detect school speed zone violations. 87 88 The use of automated traffic safety cameras is subject to the (b) 89 following restrictions: 90 91 (1) Use of traffic safety cameras is restricted to school speed 92 zones only; and 93 94 (12) Automated traffic safety cameras may only take pictures 95 record images of the vehicle and vehicle license plate and only 96 while an infraction is occurring. Pictures Images taken by 97 automated traffic safety cameras may not reveal the face of the 98 driver or of the passengers in the vehicle. 99 100 (23) Use of traffic safety cameras to detect speed violations in 101 school speed zones is restricted to the school year, as may be 102 extended, excluding summer recess and weekends, and camera 103 use on each school day will occur during two periods. The first

104 period will be 30 minutes prior to and 30 minutes after the school 105 start time, and the second period will be 30 minutes prior to and 106 30 minutes after the school end time. For any combined school zone, the first period will begin 30 minutes prior to the earliest 107 108 school start time and end 30 minutes after the latest school start 109 time, and the second period will start 30 minutes prior to the 110 earliest end time and will end 30 minutes after the latest school 111 end time periods last for one full hour beginning thirty minutes 112 prior to the start of each school day and for a second full hour 113 beginning thirty minutes prior to the end of each school day. 114 115 (c) The city shall clearly mark all locations where automated traffic 116 safety cameras are in use by placing signs in locations that clearly 117 indicate to the driver that he or she is entering a zone where traffic laws 118 are enforced by an automated traffic safety camera. 119 120 (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all photographs, 121 microphotographs and electronic images prepared under this chapter 122 and as provided in RCW 46.63.170(1)(f) are not open to the public and 123 may not be used in a court in a pending action or proceeding unless the 124 action or proceeding relates to a violation under this chapter. No 125 photograph, microphotograph or electronic image may be used for any 126 purpose other than enforcement of violations under this chapter nor 127 retained longer than necessary to enforce this chapter. 128 129 Section 3. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to 130 any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the 131 ordinance or the application of the provision to other persons or 132 circumstances is not affected. 133 134 <u>Section 4.</u> This ordinance shall be in force and effect five days 135 from and after its passage by the Kirkland City Council and publication 136 pursuant to Section 1.08.017, Kirkland Municipal Code in the summary 137 form attached to the original of this ordinance and by this reference 138 approved by the City Council. 139 140 Passed by majority vote of the Kirkland City Council in open

PUBLICATION SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. O-4880

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO COMBINED SCHOOL SPEED ZONES AND ENFORCEMENT PERIODS FOR AUTOMATED TRAFFIC SAFETY CAMERAS IN SCHOOL SPEED ZONES.

SECTION 1. Adds a new Kirkland Municipal Code Section 12.04.060 related to school and playground speed zones.

SECTION 2. Amends Kirkland Municipal Code Section 12.14.010 related to the authorized use of automated traffic safety cameras.

SECTION 3. Provides a severability clause for the ordinance.

10 SECTION 4. Authorizes publication of the ordinance by 11 summary, which summary is approved by the City Council pursuant to Section 1.08.017 Kirkland Municipal Code and establishes the effective 12 date as five days after publication of summary. 13 14
