## **ORDINANCE 0-4880**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO COMBINED SCHOOL SPEED ZONES AND ENFORCEMENT PERIODS FOR AUTOMATED TRAFFIC SAFETY CAMERAS IN SCHOOL SPEED ZONES.

WHEREAS, state law authorizes cities to create school or playground speed zones where vehicles must travel no more than twenty miles per hour; and

WHEREAS, Kirkland has established school speed zones throughout the city, including in areas where there are multiple overlapping school and school crosswalk speed zones, such as in the Finn Hill and Kingsgate neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, given the overlap between the school and school crosswalk speed zones in these particular areas and the signage requirements that accompany the beginning and ending of each zone individually, these overlapping zones are appropriately considered combined school speed zones to avoid driver confusion for signage and enforcement purposes; and

WHEREAS, Council now desires to adopt a formal regulation designating these overlapping combined school and school crosswalk zones to clearly reference and support these areas; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has previously authorized the use of automated traffic safety cameras for the detection of and issuance of infractions for traffic violations in school speed zones in order to achieve lower vehicle speeds in school zones and improve safety for school children, their families, and their caregivers; and

WHEREAS, the time periods for automated enforcement that are currently established by City code do not clearly account for combined school zones, since the start and end times vary from school to school; and

WHEREAS, increased compliance with the 20-mph school speed limit reduces the exposure of our most vulnerable road, sidewalk, and bike path users to crashes that are more likely to result in serious injuries or fatalities; and

WHEREAS, in addition to improved safety, lower vehicle speeds provide a more comfortable and lower stress environment for people walking, rolling, and bicycling to school and, therefore, encourage more transportation mode choices, in alignment with the City Council's goals of Balanced Transportation and a Sustainable Environment; and

WHEREAS, to support the goal of Kirkland's automated enforcement program to improve safety for vulnerable users of all travel modes traveling to and from school, the City Council desires to modify the enforcement period to account for combined school zones.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland do ordain as follows:

Section 1. A new section, to be titled "School and playground speed zones," is added to chapter 12.04 of the Kirkland Municipal Code (KMC), to be codified as KMC 12.04.060:

### 12.04.060 School and playground speed zones.

- (a) The speed limit in school and playground speed zones shall be 20 miles per hour when appropriate signs indicate or when flashing beacons are active, as applicable. School and playground speed zones shall be 300 feet, or as close as reasonably possible given the physical constraints of placing signage, but with marked crosswalks no less than 300 feet, in either direction from a marked school or playground crosswalk or from the border of a school or playground property. Combined school zones must be approved by the Council. The following combined school zones are authorized:
  - (1) Approximately 1,580 feet along 132nd Avenue NE from just south of NE 143rd St. to just north of NE 138th Pl.
  - (2) Approximately 4,800 feet along 84th Avenue NE from just south of NE 141st St. to NE 126th Pl.
- (b) The school and playground speed zones shall be extended beyond the distances specified in subsection (a) if a greater distance is required by RCW 46.61.440 or WAC 468-95-330.

Section 2. KMC 12.14.010, and the corresponding portions of Ordinance O-4681 § 1 (2019), is amended to read as follows, with new text shown in <u>underline</u> and deleted text shown in <u>strikethrough</u>:

## 12.14.010 Authorized use of automated traffic safety cameras.

- (a) Law enforcement officers of the city of Kirkland and persons commissioned by the Kirkland police department are authorized to use automated traffic safety cameras and related automated systems to detect school speed zone violations.
- (b) The use of automated traffic safety cameras is subject to the following restrictions:
  - (1) Use of traffic safety cameras is restricted to school speed zones only; and
  - (12) Automated traffic safety cameras may only take-pictures record images of the vehicle and vehicle license plate and only while an infraction is occurring. Pictures Images taken by automated traffic safety cameras may not reveal the face of the driver or of the passengers in the vehicle.
  - (23) Use of traffic safety cameras to detect speed violations in school speed zones is restricted to the school year, as may be extended, excluding summer recess and weekends, and camera use on each school day will occur during two periods. The first

 period will be 30 minutes prior to and 30 minutes after the school start time, and the second period will be 30 minutes prior to and 30 minutes after the school end time. For any combined school zone, the first period will begin 30 minutes prior to the earliest school start time and end 30 minutes after the latest school start time, and the second period will start 30 minutes prior to the earliest end time and will end 30 minutes after the latest school end time periods last for one full hour beginning thirty minutes prior to the start of each school day and for a second full hour beginning thirty minutes prior to the end of each school day.

- (c) The city shall clearly mark all locations where automated traffic safety cameras are in use by placing signs in locations that clearly indicate to the driver that he or she is entering a zone where traffic laws are enforced by an automated traffic safety camera.
- (d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all photographs, microphotographs and electronic images prepared under this chapter and as provided in RCW 46.63.170(1)(f) are not open to the public and may not be used in a court in a pending action or proceeding unless the action or proceeding relates to a violation under this chapter. No photograph, microphotograph or electronic image may be used for any purpose other than enforcement of violations under this chapter nor retained longer than necessary to enforce this chapter.

Section 3. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be in force and effect five days from and after its passage by the Kirkland City Council and publication pursuant to Section 1.08.017, Kirkland Municipal Code in the summary form attached to the original of this ordinance and by this reference approved by the City Council.

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### PUBLICATION SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. 0-4880

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO COMBINED SCHOOL SPEED ZONES AND ENFORCEMENT PERIODS FOR AUTOMATED TRAFFIC SAFETY CAMERAS IN SCHOOL SPEED ZONES.

<u>SECTION 1</u>. Adds a new Kirkland Municipal Code Section 12.04.060 related to school and playground speed zones.

<u>SECTION 2</u>. Amends Kirkland Municipal Code Section 12.14.010 related to the authorized use of automated traffic safety cameras.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. Provides a severability clause for the ordinance.

<u>SECTION 4</u>. Authorizes publication of the ordinance by summary, which summary is approved by the City Council pursuant to Section 1.08.017 Kirkland Municipal Code and establishes the effective date as five days after publication of summary.
