RESOLUTION R-5641

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DEFERRING DEVELOPMENT OF THE HOMELESSNESS CONTINUUM OF CARE ACTION PLAN AS CALLED FOR RESOLUTION R-5631 UNTIL 2025.

WHEREAS, on June 4, 2024, the City Council adopted 2 Resolution R-5631 declaring the city's commitment to addressing 3 homelessness through a person-centered approach and authorizing the 4 City Manager to develop a Homelessness Continuum of Care Action 5 Plan for new policies, programs, and services that prevent and respond 6 to unsheltered homelessness in Kirkland; and

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8 WHEREAS, R-5631 directed the City Manager to create a 9 Homelessness Continuum of Care Action Plan to be presented for 10 Council consideration by December 31, 2024; and 11

12 WHEREAS, City staff initially planned for a robust community 13 engagement process in support of the action plan to be conducted from 14 August through October of 2024; and 15

16 WHEREAS, the adoption of both the City's Comprehensive Plan 17 and biennial budget are required by state law to occur before the end of 18 the year, and both efforts as well as other emerging issues have 19 necessitated an increased amount of staff time and community focus 20 than originally anticipated. 21

22 NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the 23 City of Kirkland as follows: 24

25 The City Council reaffirms its commitment to Section 1. 26 addressing homelessness through a person-centered approach and all 27 other actions as articulated in R-5631, included as Exhibit A, except for 28 Section 1, presentation of the Homelessness Continuum of Care Action 29 Plan by the City Manager to the Council by December 31, 2024. 30

31 Section 2. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed 32 to implement the community engagement called for in R-5631 in the first 33 quarter of 2025 and transmit the Homelessness Continuum of Care 34 Action Plan to be presented for Council consideration by April 30, 2025. 35

RESOLUTION R-5631

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CITY'S KIRKLAND DECLARING COMMITMENT TO THE HOMELESSNESS THROUGH PERSON-ADDRESSING A CENTERED APPROACH AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO DEVELOP A HOMELESSNESS CONTINUUM OF CARE ACTION PLAN FOR NEW POLICIES, PROGRAMS, AND SERVICES THAT PREVENT AND RESPOND TO UNSHELTERED HOMELESSNESS IN KIRKLAND.

WHEREAS, the City Council's Goals include both 'Attainable Housing', to provide access to housing and encourage the construction and preservation of housing stock that meet a diverse range of incomes and needs, and 'Supportive Human Services,' to meet basic human needs, help people through economic and personal crises, help individuals thrive, and strive to remove barriers to allow all equal opportunities to succeed; and

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9 WHEREAS, ensuring access to safe and stable places to live is 10 foundational for creating a community where everyone belongs; and

12 WHEREAS, the City Council desires that the experience of 13 homelessness be rare, brief, and non-recurring in the city and has made 14 significant investments over time in local and regional housing and 15 homelessness projects and programs to accomplish this goal; and 16

17 WHEREAS, in 2023, the City Manager convened an 18 interdepartmental team, titled the Coordinated Response to 19 Homelessness Team, consisting of leadership across numerous City 20 departments to ensure interdepartmental coordination, streamline 21 processes, and maximize resources across the homelessness response 22 system; and 23

24 WHEREAS, the City is in the midst of a major update of its 25 Comprehensive Plan, including both the Housing and Human Services 26 Elements, with a focus on creating new and enhanced policies to foster the creation of more affordable housing units in Kirkland and to support 28 the City's response to homelessness; and

30 WHEREAS, the Coordinated Response to Homelessness Team 31 prioritizes a person-centered and compassionate approach when 32 considering situations involving unhoused community members while 33 also ensuring the safety of unhoused persons, housed neighbors, 34 businesses, visitors, and responding staff; and 35

36 WHEREAS, the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth 37 Circuit has made several rulings cautioning cities against taking actions 38 to criminalize homelessness, including enforcement of overnight 39 camping bans on public spaces unless nearby shelter is available, and

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40 the Supreme Court of the United States is reviewing these decisions in 41 2024; and

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43 WHEREAS, the City of Kirkland's Homeless Outreach 44 Coordinator engaged 124 households representing 160 individuals 45 experiencing homelessness in 2023, the most recent Point-in-Time 46 Count showed a 23% increase in homelessness in King County from 47 2022 to 2024, and there is growing concern that the rising cost of 48 housing will continue to exacerbate the rate at which individuals enter 49 homelessness for the first time; and

51 WHEREAS, other jurisdictions in King County have seen rapid 52 increases of unhoused residents camping in public spaces and have 53 urged all cities to proactively prepare to respond to such increases; and 54

55 WHEREAS, the City Council remains committed to ensuring 56 public spaces in Kirkland are safe, accessible, and enjoyed by all; and 57

58 WHEREAS, the City Council affirms that the City of Kirkland is not a regional homelessness service provider such as King County 59 60 government, the King County Regional Homelessness Authority, and 61 regional non-profit organizations, and that the actions identified through 62 resolution are intended to support those experiencing this 63 homelessness in Kirkland and connect them to regional services; and 64

65 WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes it needs to make 66 concurrent investments in programs, policies, and services along the 67 housing and homelessness continuum of care to keep Kirkland a 68 belonging community enjoyed by all and a place where community 69 members experiencing housing instability have access to resources 70 needed to thrive, with the goal that homelessness is rare, brief, and non-71 recurring.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows: 75

Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to create a Homelessness Continuum of Care Action Plan to be presented for Council consideration by December 31, 2024.

80 Section 2. The Homelessness Continuum of Care Action Plan 81 shall provide objectives and actions to support, at minimum, the 82 following identified policy goal areas: 83

- a. Prevent homelessness where possible through continued investment in prevention programs and support of legislation that creates and retains additional affordable housing units.
- b. When homelessness occurs, support unhoused individuals in their transition back to stable housing through relationshipbuilding and re-connecting to resources.
- c. Provide a compassionate and dynamic response to situations involving unhoused residents, acting on a case-by-case basis to
