RESOLUTION R-5642

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND OPPOSING INITIATIVE MEASURE NO. 2117 CONCERNING CARBON TAX CREDIT TRADING.

WHEREAS, Washington State has placed a ballot measure before the voters with the official ballot measure title of "Initiative Measure No. 2117 concerns carbon tax credit trading"; and

WHEREAS, Initiative Measure No. 2117 is scheduled to go to the voters during the November 5, 2024, Washington General Election; and

WHEREAS, Washington State Secretary of State has identified that Initiative Measure No. 2117 would prohibit state agencies from imposing any type of carbon tax credit trading, including "cap and trade" or "cap and tax" programs, regardless of whether the resulting increased costs are imposed on fuel recipients or fuel suppliers. It would repeal sections of the 2021 Washington Climate Commitment Act as amended, including repealing the creation and modification of a "cap and invest" program to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by specific entities; and

WHEREAS, the Climate Commitment Act has already advanced efforts to protect our air and water and has generated \$3.25 billion for forest protection and wildfire mitigation, transportation projects, electrification infrastructure, salmon recovery, tribal investments, and more; and

WHEREAS, in 2020, Kirkland City Council adopted a Sustainability Master Plan, since renamed to Sustainability Strategic Plan, which sets environmental goals for the community and identifies about 200 actions the City can take to help the community meet its goals; and

WHEREAS, the City's Sustainability Strategic Plan and 2015 Comprehensive Plan identified policy goals of achieving 50% reductions in greenhouse gas emission reductions by 2030 and 80% reductions by 2050 as compared to a 2007 baseline; and

WHEREAS, the City is an active participant in the King County-Cities Climate Collaboration (K4C) and has adopted by Resolution R-5406 the Joint Letter of Commitment for Climate Change Actions, which includes advocating for comprehensive federal, regional, and state science-based limits and market-based price on carbon pollution; and

WHEREAS, Initiative Measure No. 2117 would repeal the Climate Commitment Act which in turn would eliminate numerous climate and air quality programs as well as the funding source for investments in climate projects throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, the Climate Commitment Act aims to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and supports implementation of the City's Sustainability Strategic Plan; and

WHEREAS, adoption of Initiative Measure No. 2117 would hinder the City's ability to achieve greenhouse gas emission reductions as identified in the City's Sustainability Strategic Plan and K4C Joint Letter of Commitment for Climate Change Actions; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with RCW 42.17A.555(1), notice of the meeting during which this Resolution is being voted on included the title and number of the ballot measure, and members of the public and City Councilmembers were afforded an approximately equal opportunity for the expression of an opposing view.; and

WHEREAS, with this Resolution the City Council desires to oppose Initiative Measure No. 2117.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

The City Council of the City of Kirkland hereby declares its official position in opposition to Initiative Measure No. 2117 concerning carbon tax credit trading.

Passed by majority vote of the Kirkland City Council in open meeting this 17th day of September, 2024.
