RESOLUTION R-5643

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND OPPOSING INITIATIVE MEASURE NO. 2066 CONCERNING REGULATING ENERGY SERVICES, INCLUDING NATURAL GAS AND ELECTRIFICATION.

WHEREAS, Washington State has placed a ballot measure before the voters with the official ballot measure title of "Initiative Measure No. 2066 concerns regulating energy services, including natural gas and electrification"; and

WHEREAS, Initiative Measure No. 2066 is scheduled to go to the voters during the November 5, 2024, Washington General Election; and

WHEREAS, Washington State Secretary of State has identified that Initiative Measure No. 2066 would require utilities and local governments to provide natural gas to eligible customers; prevent state approval of rate plans requiring or incentivizing gas service termination, restricting access to gas service, or making it cost-prohibitive; and prohibit the state energy code, localities, and air pollution control agencies from penalizing gas use. It would repeal sections of chapter 351, Laws of 2024, including planning requirements for cost-effective electrification and prohibitions on gas rebates and incentives; and

WHEREAS, in 2020, Kirkland City Council adopted a Sustainability Master Plan, since renamed to Sustainability Strategic Plan, which sets environmental goals for the community and identifies about 200 actions the City can take to help the community meet its goals; and

WHEREAS, the City's Sustainability Strategic Plan and 2015 Comprehensive Plan identified policy goals of achieving 50% reductions in greenhouse gas emission reductions by 2030 and 80% reductions by 2050 as compared to a 2007 baseline; and

WHEREAS, as of 2017, emissions from natural gas used for heat and other gas appliances made up 21% or 138,000 MTCO2e (metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent) of Kirkland's community greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, the total of which in 2017 reflected a 22% reduction from the 2007 baseline; and

WHEREAS, reducing the use of natural gas in buildings and converting existing systems to clean electric is an identified recommendation in the City's Sustainability Strategic Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City is an active participant in the King County-Cities Climate Collaboration (K4C) and has adopted by Resolution R-5406 the Joint Letter of Commitment for Climate Change Actions; and

WHEREAS, the K4C Joint Letter of Commitment for Climate Change Actions includes several goals that advocate for the reduction of natural gas utilization including the reduction of natural gas and other fossil fuel use in existing buildings by at least 20% in 2030 and 80% by 2050; and

WHEREAS, Initiative Measure No. 2066 would require gas utilities and local governments to provide natural gas to customers who demand it, even if other energy services or energy sources are available; and

WHEREAS, Initiative Measure No. 2066 would prohibit local governments, air pollution control agencies, and the State Building Code Council from prohibiting, penalizing, or discouraging the use of natural gas; and

WHEREAS, adoption of Initiative Measure No. 2066 would infringe on the City's ability to achieve greenhouse gas reduction goals and natural gas reduction strategies identified in the City's Sustainability Strategic Plan and K4C Joint Letter of Commitment for Climate Change Actions; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with RCW 42.17A.555(1), notice of the meeting during which this Resolution is being voted on included the title and number of the ballot measure, and members of the public and City Councilmembers were afforded an approximately equal opportunity for the expression of an opposing view; and

WHEREAS, with this Resolution, the City Council desires to oppose Initiative Measure No. 2066.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

The City Council of the City of Kirkland hereby declares its official opposition to Initiative Measure No. 2066 concerning regulating energy services, including natural gas and electrification.

Passed by majority vote of the Kirkland City Council in open meeting this 17th day of September, 2024.
