ORDINANCE 0-4897

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO A SHORT EXTENSION OF THE PLANNED ACTION ORDINANCE FOR PARKPLACE AND AMENDING ORDINANCE 0-4473.

WHEREAS, in 2015, the City Council adopted a Planned Action Ordinance (Ordinance O-4473), a Master Plan, and a Development Agreement, allowing for the development of a mixed-use project called Parkplace, now known as Kirkland Urban; and

WHEREAS, on January 27, 2025, the property owner has requested an extension of both the Planned Action Ordinance and the Development Agreement because the project has not yet been fully completed; and

WHEREAS, absent extension of the Planned Action Ordinance, both the Planned Action Ordinance and the Development Agreement will expire on March 1, 2025; and

WHEREAS, Council finds that the development of Kirkland Urban has produced numerous public benefits, including vibrant new retail spaces, tree-lined streets, needed office space and apartments, and extensive public open spaces, in addition to supporting downtown transit investments; and

WHEREAS, Section 6 of the Planned Action Ordinance states that the ordinance may be extended by the City Council beyond March 1, 2025, "following a report from the SEPA [State Environmental Policy Act] Official and a public hearing"; and

WHEREAS, state law does not require that the City Council hold a public hearing to extend an existing planned action ordinance; and

WHEREAS, Council may modify requirements imposed upon itself in Ordinance O-4473; and

WHEREAS, to allow for the public input envisioned in the Planned Action Ordinance requiring holding a public hearing as part of any extension, Council desires to hold a meaningful public hearing to consider a longer-term extension of the Planned Action Ordinance and the Development Agreement; and

WHEREAS, given the imminent expiration of the Planned Action Ordinance and the Development Agreement, there is not sufficient time to hold a meaningful public hearing process with abundant public notice; and

WHEREAS, Council finds that completion of the project may be unnecessarily delayed if a short extension is not granted to provide the City and the public an opportunity to evaluate the requested extension; and

WHEREAS, to avoid expiration of the Planned Action Ordinance prior to having an opportunity to hold the public hearing and to evaluate the implications of a longer extension, Council has determined that it is appropriate to provide a short extension of the Planned Action Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 6 of the Planned Action Ordinance for Parkplace, now known as Kirkland Urban, as adopted in Ordinance O-4473, is hereby amended to read as follows, with new text shown in underline and deleted text shown in strikethrough; while the remainder of Ordinance O-4733 is not modified:

<u>Section 6. Sunset.</u> The provisions of this Ordinance shall be of no force and effect on and after <u>March June</u> 1, 2025, unless the Ordinance is extended by the City Council following a report from the SEPA Responsible Official and a public hearing.

Section 2. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.

<u>Section 3.</u> This ordinance shall be in force and effect five days from and after its passage by the Kirkland City Council and publication, as required by law.
