

RESOLUTION NO. 160

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KIRKLAND, WASHINGTON: That the UNION OIL COMPANY OF CALIFORNIA, a corporation, be and the same is hereby permitted and granted the authority to locate, erect, maintain, and operate, within the corporate limits of the Town of Kirkland, and outside of the restricted fire limits thereof in the vicinity of Jackson Street and Lake Avenue, warehouses, storage tanks, and all other necessary buildings and appurtenances thereto, together with approaches and connection with said streets, for the purpose of storing, handling, distributing and selling, at wholesale and retail, gasoline, lubricating oils, greases and other petroleum products of said Union Oil Company of California, a corporation; that said proposed and authorized structures and improvements be erected and maintained with all proper safe guards, and in accordance with the practice followed by said company at its various sub-stations and distributing plants, and operated and cared for in proper manner and in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington, and the ordinances of the Town of Kirkland.

That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect Five days from and after its passage and approval and publication according to law.
