

Resolution No. 168

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KIRKLAND.

Section 1. Whereas, the main line pipe leading from the settling tank of the Town water works system down to the end of the new eight inch iron water main near the post office on Lake avenue; and, also, the main line pipe on Second street extending from Twelveth avenue North to Fifteenth Avenue North and thence east to the water tanks have now been in the ground for more than eighteen years, and by reason thereof have deteriorated to such an extent that the same are subject to frequent breaks which require the expenditure of large sums of money to keep them in repair, and there is danger that the same may break to such an extent as to endanger the water supply of the Town; and that by reason of the foregoing conditions an emergency exists which requires the immediate replacement of all of said main line pipes above mentioned, Therefore, it is resolved,

Section 2. That the Town Council is hereby authorized to take all necessary and proper steps for the immediate replacement of said main line pipes with new eight inch iron ^{or wood} water pipe, and in payment ~~for~~ for the same, and the expenses incident to placing the same in the ground ready for service to issue and dispose of emergency ~~in~~ time warrants of said Town, the same to be in the total amount of \$ 9000, of which the sum of \$ 2000.00 shall become due and payable in the year 1935; \$ 3500.00 shall become due and payable in the year 1936, and \$ 3500.00 ^{more or less} shall become due and payable in the year ~~1937~~; all of said warrants to bear interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, all of the ~~six~~ Town's portion of such expenditure to be payable out of the income of the water works system.
