

RESOLUTION NO. 170

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KIRKLAND:

Section 1. That it is the intention of the Town Council to order the improvement of Second Street from the end of the existing eight-inch cast iron water-main near Twelfth Avenue to Fifteenth Avenue and thence east on Fifteenth Avenue to the existing water tanks of the water system of said town, by replacing the wooden service water-main now in place and extending along said streets with a new eight-inch iron water main, and doing such other work as may be necessary in connection therewith, in accordance with plans and specifications of the engineer in the employ of the Town of Kirkland.

Section 2. That all persons desiring to object thereto are hereby notified to appear and present such objections, in writing, at a meeting of the Town Council to be held in the Council Chambers of the Town of Kirkland, at eight o'clock p.m., on the 21 day of November, 1932, which time and place are hereby fixed for hearing all matters relating to said improvement, and all objections thereto, and for determining the method of payment for said improvement.

Section 3. That the engineer in the employ of the Town of Kirkland shall, in the manner provided by law, submit to the Town Council, at or prior to said date, all data and information required by law to be submitted.

Section 4. That the cost and expense of said improvement shall be borne and assessed in the following proportion, to-wit: 50 per cent thereof shall be assessed to the property abutting the line of said improvement which is specially benefitted thereby, and 50 per cent thereof by the said Town of Kirkland.
