

RESOLUTION NO. 172

WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 129, now under consideration by the State Legislature of the State of Washington, as enacted, would effectively take away from Kirkland the right of home rule, subjects us to the dictation and domination of larger cities owning electric light and power plants, without even the right to appeal to the State Board of Public Works in the matter of rates or regulations, and

WHEREAS, such bill would take from the tax roll large amounts of taxable property, with no recompense or relief to remaining tax-payers of the cities and counties that might be thus ^aaffected, to the general detriment of all the people in both counties and cities in sections that might be so ^aaffected:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Kirkland as representative of the people of Kirkland, Washington that we emphatically and insistentlly oppose the enactment of such action, and that we urgently request that the Legislature of the State of Washington defeat or drastically amend the proposed measure.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of the Resolution be sent to each of the members of the Legislature from this county.
