Resolution No. 186
Of the Town of Kirkland

In the matter of outstanding Warrants in Local Improvement Districts No. 33 and 36.

Whereas, in the construction of Local Improvement District No. 33 for the installation of water mains, L.I.D. Warrant No. 1518 was issued May 7, 1917, in favor of the Water Fund of the City, of which Warrant a part has been paid, but there is now outstanding \$759.07 unpaid, and

Whereas, in the construction of Local Improvement District NO. 36 for the installation of water mains, L.I.D. Warrant No. 1519 was issued May 7th., 1917 in favor of the Water Fund of the City, of which Warrant a part has been paid, but there is now outstanding \$155.89 unpaid, and

Whereas, in Local Improvement District No. 36 there were also issued on June 4, 1917, the following Warrants to various parties, all of which are now unclaimed or unpaid and all of the parties known or believed to be dead:

making a total of in District No. 36 of \$ 173.28 of Warrants outstanding and unpaid, and

Whereas, the City has had the use of the Water mains in said Districts since 1917 and the same are now a part of the water system in operation and,

Whereas, the Statute of Limitations has long since run against all said Warrants to all the parties interested, and the legal right to collect assessments in said Districts has long since expired by Statute of Limitations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE City Clerk and the City Treasurer be instructed to cancel all said Warrants on the records of the City, with the understanding that in case any owner of any of said six small Warrants listed above shall ever present any such Warrant, for payment, the Council may take up the matter of paying the same. *de novo.*
