

R E S O L U T I O N N O. 197

WHEREAS, At the last regular annual election for officers of the Town of Kirkland, King County, Washington, the question of the advancement of said town to a city of the third class was regularly and duly submitted to the electors of said town for adoption or rejection; and

WHEREAS, The proper officers have duly certified to the clerk of said town the whole number of votes given at such election, with the number given for such advancement and the number against it, and such certificate has been duly laid before this regular meeting of the Council of said town; and

WHEREAS, It appears from such certificate that a majority of such votes was in favor of such advancement, and said town contains the requisite number of inhabitants to entitle it to such advancement, according to the State census; it is

RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF SAID TOWN, That the inhabitants thereof have decided in favor of the advancement of said town to a city of the third class; and the clerk of said town is hereby directed to certify this resolution to the Board of County Commissioners of the County of King, State of Washington, as provided by law.
