

RESOLUTION R-5694

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND  
ALLOCATING THE CITY'S PORTION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT  
BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FUNDS FOR 2026.

1        WHEREAS, on May 20, 2014, the City Council authorized the City of Kirkland's  
2 participation in the King County Community Development Block Grant and HOME Investment  
3 Partnerships Program (CDBG/HOME) Consortium as a Joint Agreement City and the City  
4 entered into an Interlocal Agreement with King County for that purpose; and

5        WHEREAS, on September 5, 2023, the City Council approved extending its Interlocal  
6 Agreement with King County as a Joint Agreement City through 2026; and

7        WHEREAS, as a Joint Agreement City, the City receives funds in support of programs  
8 and projects that directly benefit the Kirkland community, including but not limited to home  
9 repair, affordable housing, community facilities, public infrastructure, and human services; and

10       WHEREAS, as part of the Interlocal Agreement with King County, the City must  
11 develop a plan for allocating its portion of the CDBG funds each year; and

12       WHEREAS, to inform development of such a plan, the City's Human Services  
13 Commission held a public hearing on August 26, 2025, at which time the Commission provided  
14 an opportunity for the public to comment on recommendations for the plan and thereafter  
15 adopted recommendations for funding allocations, which recommendations have been  
16 submitted to the City Council.

17       NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as  
18 follows:

19       Section 1. The recommendations of the Human Services Commission for allocating  
20 the City of Kirkland's portion of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for 2026  
21 are accepted and approved by the City Council.

22       Section 2. Based on estimates provided by the United States Department of Housing  
23 and Urban Development (HUD), the City intends to allocate 2026 CDBG funds as follows:

24               (a) \$169,026.00 of Capital Projects funds to A Regional Coalition for Housing for  
25 affordable housing projects;


26               (b) \$44,481.00 of Public Services funds to Porchlight to support its 24/7/365  
27 enhanced emergency shelter for men experiencing homelessness; and

28               (c) \$44,481.00 of Planning & Administration funds to support the City's administration  
29 of the CDBG program.

30       Section 3. In the event the funding level provided by HUD is more or less than  
31 estimated, the above projects, services, and administration should receive proportionate  
32 increases or decreases based upon the final distribution amount.


