

RESOLUTION R-5694

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND
ALLOCATING THE CITY'S PORTION OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT
BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) FUNDS FOR 2026.

WHEREAS, on May 20, 2014, the City Council authorized the City of Kirkland's participation in the King County Community Development Block Grant and HOME Investment Partnerships Program (CDBG/HOME) Consortium as a Joint Agreement City and the City entered into an Interlocal Agreement with King County for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, on September 5, 2023, the City Council approved extending its Interlocal Agreement with King County as a Joint Agreement City through 2026; and

WHEREAS, as a Joint Agreement City, the City receives funds in support of programs and projects that directly benefit the Kirkland community, including but not limited to home repair, affordable housing, community facilities, public infrastructure, and human services; and

WHEREAS, as part of the Interlocal Agreement with King County, the City must develop a plan for allocating its portion of the CDBG funds each year; and

WHEREAS, to inform development of such a plan, the City's Human Services Commission held a public hearing on August 26, 2025, at which time the Commission provided an opportunity for the public to comment on recommendations for the plan and thereafter adopted recommendations for funding allocations, which recommendations have been submitted to the City Council.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The recommendations of the Human Services Commission for allocating the City of Kirkland's portion of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for 2026 are accepted and approved by the City Council.

Section 2. Based on estimates provided by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), the City intends to allocate 2026 CDBG funds as follows:

(a) \$169,026.00 of Capital Projects funds to A Regional Coalition for Housing for affordable housing projects;

(b) \$44,481.00 of Public Services funds to Porchlight to support its 24/7/365 enhanced emergency shelter for men experiencing homelessness; and

(c) \$44,481.00 of Planning & Administration funds to support the City's administration of the CDBG program.

Section 3. In the event the funding level provided by HUD is more or less than estimated, the above projects, services, and administration should receive proportionate increases or decreases based upon the final distribution amount.


