

RESOLUTION

No. 280 *A*

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND:

Whereas the Federal Government has allocated funds for the construction of the Kirkland Sewer System, designated as Washington, 45-151, Defense Public Works, Unit No. 3, and:

Whereas, Unit No. 3, more specifically known as the Houghton Shipyard area has not yet been commenced and:

Whereas the residents of the Houghton area are circulating a petition requesting the City of Kirkland to create a sewer district in said vicinity and:

Whereas there will be a delay of several months before a district therein is created and:

Whereas there exists an emergency for the immediate construction of said Unit 3 and L. R. Durkee, Regional Engineer, Federal Works Agency has by letter of March 24, 1942, requested the City of Kirkland to proceed under its own responsibility with the design and construction of Unit 3 and thus obviate delay in waiting for the formation of a district and:

Whereas the King County Housing Authority has been authorized to construct 100 housing units requiring immediate water facilities in the Houghton area and:

Whereas an emergency exists requiring the immediate action for the construction of said system,

NOW THEREFORE it is hereby resolved by the City of Kirkland that Harry Sisler, Engineer for the Kirkland Sewer Project be requested to proceed without delay with the necessary surveying, plans, and contract documents and call for contractors' bids, and do everything necessary to expedite the construction of said Unit 3 of the above project. It is further resolved that the City of Kirkland proceed under Chapter 193 Session Laws of the State of Washington, if the same be found practicable in order to complete the entire Sewer Project to the best interests and welfare of all persons concerned.
