Resolution No. 389

WHEREAS, a hearing on the proposal to form a public utility district in King County to include the area outside of the Seattle metropolitan area has been fixed for 10:00 a.m. on Monday, September 27, 1948, before the Board of King County Commissioners in Room No. 402, County-City Building, Seattle; and

WHEREAS, said district, if formed, would have the power of condemnation of the properties of Puget Sound Power & Light Company within the Town and adjacent area without a vote of the people; and

WHEREAS, the Company now renders adequate service in the Town at rates which have declined over the years, rather than increased, as have the prices for all other commodities used by our citizens, and it is the conviction of the members of the Town Council and the Town Officials that said proposal is inimical to the welfare of the Town and of its citizens;

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED, That the Town and the Town Officials do hereby register disapproval of said proposal for the formation of a public utility district in King County and, in the event such a public utility district is to be formed, the Town respectfully petitions the Board of County Commissioners of King County to exclude the Town from the boundaries of the proposed district.
