

RESOLUTION NO. 481

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, WASHINGTON

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND
AS FOLLOWS:

1. THAT a Special Election be called, coincident to the
September, 1962, Primary Election, for the purpose of submitting
to the voters of the City of Kirkland the following proposition:

"SHALL LEASH LAW BE ADOPTED?"

Shall the Kirkland City Council adopt an Ordinance
making it unlawful to allow dogs to be "at large"
and providing penalties for violation, including
impounding of dogs found "at large". "At large"
shall mean: Off the premises of the owner (or person
having possession) and not under control either by leash,
cord, chain or otherwise of such person, or a member
of his immediate family?"

2. That the Clerk be directed to furnish a certified copy of
this RESOLUTION to the King County Auditor, as ex-officio supervisor
of elections.

This RESOLUTION unanimously adopted in regular meeting
July 16, 1962.
