

RESOLUTION NO. 483

of the
CITY OF KIRKLAND

WHEREAS, LAKE WASHINGTON SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 414 has announced plans to make application to the State Board of Education for authorization to establish a community Junior College, and

WHEREAS, there exists in the area served by said School District approximately 160 acres of State owned land contiguous to the Redmond City Limits and adjacent to the site of the Redmond Senior High School of said School District, to-wit:

The Southeast Quarter ($SE\frac{1}{4}$) of the Northwest Quarter ($NW\frac{1}{4}$), the South Half of the NE Quarter ($S\frac{1}{2}$ of the $NE\frac{1}{4}$), and the Northeast Quarter ($NE\frac{1}{4}$) of the Southeast Quarter ($SE\frac{1}{4}$), all in Section 36, Township 26, North, Range 5, E.W.M., King County, Washington, and

WHEREAS, such property would make an attractive site for such a junior college and is ideally situated geographically to serve the growing needs of this portion of King County and of the State of Washington; and

WHEREAS, such property may be readily acquired from the State for the purpose of locating such a school facility, at a nominal cost to the district and without the necessity of an expensive purchase of other land or taking other land off the tax rolls; and

WHEREAS, such property may be served with municipal water and sewer and other utilities, easily and economically, by short extensions of existing systems; and

WHEREAS, the City of Kirkland is vitally interested in the early establishment of the proposed community junior college at the most practical site in the area served by the LAKE WASHINGTON SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 414; Now, Therefore,


BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Kirkland recommend that the Board of Directors of the Lake Washington School District No. 414 and the State Board of Education take immediate steps

for the early establishment of a community junior college in the Lake Washington School District No. 414 area, and that action be taken to acquire the State owned property above described as the most practical site for such college.


