

RESOLUTION NO. 560

A RESOLUTION RELATING TO UNIFORM TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES FOR STREETS AND HIGHWAYS

"WHEREAS, in the interest of public safety and to facilitate the orderly movement of traffic, it is highly desirable that uniform traffic control devices be installed on streets and highways,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Kirkland, that the City of Kirkland does hereby endorse in principle Part V of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways, dated June, 1961, that has been prepared by the National Joint Committee on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, as adopted by the Washington State Highway Commission by Resolution #1391 and adopts said Part V as a guide and also endorses the Manual on Signals of the Washington State Highway Commission, as adopted by the Washington State Highway Commission by Resolution #1487, to provide uniformity in the establishment of traffic control devices within this city, to be accomplished within a period of approximately two years, recognizing that the decision to use a particular device at a particular location must be made on the basis of a proper engineering study at the location."
