

RESOLUTION NO. 2063

A RESOLUTION OF THE KIRKLAND CITY COUNCIL DECLARING RESOLUTION NO. 206 ADOPTED MAY 29, 1938, BY THE KIRKLAND CITY COUNCIL, TO BE REPEALED.

WHEREAS, the Kirkland City Council on May 29, 1938, did adopt Resolution No. 206 purporting to limit the number of tavern licenses to be issued within the City limits of the City of Kirkland, and

WHEREAS, since said time of enactment the City of Kirkland through annexations and consolidation with the City of Houghton has increased in geographical size many times over, and

WHEREAS, the population of said City has likewise increased many times over, and

WHEREAS, question has been raised as to the survival of said resolution following consolidation of the cities of Houghton and Kirkland, and

WHEREAS, the Council does find that said limitation on the number of taverns to be licensed within the City of Kirkland is no longer appropriate to the City as it now exists,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

1. Resolution No. 206 of the City of Kirkland adopted May 29, 1938 be, and it hereby is, repealed in toto and deemed to be null and void.

ADOPTED by majority vote of the Kirkland City Council in regular meeting on the 6th day of July, 1970.
