

RESOLUTION NO. 2101

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND, WASHINGTON, APPROVING IN PRINCIPAL THE CONCEPT OF JOINT UNDERTAKING FOR FINANCING PREPARATION OF A COMPREHENSIVE WATER POLLUTION CONTROL AND ABATEMENT PLAN.

WHEREAS, the laws of the United States and the State of Washington, and the regulations of federal and state regulatory agencies now severely restrict availability of grants for water pollution control purposes to any municipality in any drainage basin for which a comprehensive water pollution control and abatement plan has not been developed; and

WHEREAS, the health and welfare of the residents of the City of Kirkland, (herein called "City") require that the control and abatement of water pollution control problems be adequately planned for on a regional basis; and

WHEREAS, the various concerned municipalities located within the drainage basin in which the City is located can most effectively, economically and efficiently develop a comprehensive water pollution control and abatement plan for such basin by cooperating in a study jointly financed and prepared.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Kirkland, Washington, as follows:

Section 1. The City Council approves the concept of Ribco and the joint and coordinated preparation of a comprehensive water pollution control and abatement plan. The City Council further would be willing to authorize the City to enter into a participating contract, provided said contract clearly set forth the financial and work assignment allocations as to each of the participating agencies, and the representative agencies, including the City of Kirkland.
