RESOLUTION NO. 2142

WHEREAS the municipality of Metropolitan Seattle together with the Puget Sound Governmental Conference, have heretofore undertaken extensive studies and investigation of the feasibility of providing efficient and reasonable transit service to the residents of King County, and their consultants, Daniel, Mann, Johnson and Mendenhall, having heretofore prepared and submitted plans, feasibility study and like data, and

WHEREAS it has been determined and the City Council of the City of Kirkland so finding that such proposed transit service would be of substantial benefit to the public and especially to the citizens of Kirkland who are urgently in need of improved, regular and reasonable transportation, NOW THEREFORE

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND AS FOLLOWS:

1. The City Council of the City of Kirkland hereby finds and determines that the proposed "Metro Transit Plan" as heretofore presented, is proper, reasonable and of benefit to the general public and especially the citizens of Kirkland, in providing regular, efficient and inexpensive transportation to the public. The City of Kirkland hereby goes on record in fully supporting the principles of such plan and urges its implementation at the earliest possible date.
