

RESOLUTION NO. 2167

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND URGING INCLUSION OF PEDESTRIAN AND BICYCLE ACCESS IN ANY FUTURE EXPANSION OF THE EVERGREEN POINT FLOATING BRIDGE.

WHEREAS, pedestrian and bicycle trail systems have been extensively developed and established on both the west side and the east side of Lake Washington in the vicinity of the Evergreen Point Floating Bridge, and

WHEREAS, the Evergreen Point Floating Bridge does not presently provide access for pedestrian or bicycle travel, and

WHEREAS, such access would enhance and expand the usability of the existing pedestrian and bicycle trail system,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The Kirkland City Council urges the Washington State Highway Department to, early in any studies therefor, consider and provide for pedestrian and bicycle access in any expansion of the Evergreen Point Bridge facility.

Section 2. The Director of Administration and Finance is directed to provide a certified copy of this Resolution to the Washington State Department of Highways and the Washington State Highway Commission.
