A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND APPROVING A CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT AS APPLIED FOR BY NORTHWEST COLLEGE, BEING DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FILE NO. CUP-74-29(H), IN REGARD TO THE LOCATION AND CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW LIBRARY BUILDING ON THE CAMPUS OF NORTHWEST COLLEGE, AND SETTING FORTH CONDITIONS TO WHICH SUCH CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT SHALL BE SUBJECT.

WHEREAS, the Kirkland Department of Community Development has received an application for a Conditional Use Permit, said application having been made by Northwest College of Assemblies of God, and said property as legally described in said application in zone RS 8.5, and

WHEREAS, colleges and college buildings are allowed within an RS 8.5 zone upon issuance of a Conditional Use Permit, and

WHEREAS, the application has been submitted to the Houghton Community Council and to the Kirkland Planning Commission who held public hearing thereon at their regular meetings of November 12, 1974 and January 7, 1975; and January 9, 1975 respectively, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to City of Kirkland Resolution No. 2181 concerning environmental policy of the State Environmental Policy Act, an environmental worksheet has been submitted to the City, reviewed by the responsible official of the City of Kirkland and a negative declaration reached, and

WHEREAS, said environmental worksheet and declaration have been available and accompanied the application through the entire review process, and

WHEREAS, the Kirkland Planning Commission, after their public hearing and consideration of the recommendations of the Department of Community Development and having available to them the environmental worksheet and negative declaration, did adopt certain Findings, Conclusions and Recommendations and did recommend approval of the Conditional Use Permit subject to the specific conditions set forth in said recommendations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The Conditional Use Permit is hereby given approval subject to the conditions set forth in Findings, Conclusions and Recommendations of the Kirkland Planning Commission as signed by the chairman thereof and filed in Department of Community Development File No. CUP-74-29(H), which Findings, Conclusions and Recommendations are by this reference adopted by the Kirkland City Council as though fully set forth herein.

Section 2. A certified copy of this resolution, together with the Findings, Conclusions and Recommendations herein adopted shall attach to and become a part of the Conditional Use Permit approval, or evidence thereof delivered to the permittee.

Section 3. Nothing in this resolution should be construed as excusing the applicant from compliance with any federal, state or local statues, ordinances or regulations applicable to this project, other than expressly set forth herein.

Section 4. The Conditional Use Permit applied for by Northwest College of Assemblies of God shall issue, subject to the performance standards and other conditions of approval set forth herein above mentioned and included by reference in the foregoing Findings. Failure on the part of the holder of a Conditional Use Permit to initially meet or maintain strict compliance with said standards and conditions shall be grounds for revocation in accordance with Section 23.56.110 of Ordinance No. 2183.

Section 5. Notwithstanding the recommendations heretofore given by the Houghton Community Council, the subject matter of this Resolution and the Conditional Use Permit herein granted are, pursuant to Ordinance No. 2001, subject to the disapproval jurisdiction of the Houghton Community Council, and therefore this Resolution shall become effective only upon approval of the Houghton Community Council or the failure of said community council to disapprove this resolution within 60 days of the date of the passage of this resolution.

PIRDINGS:

- The application is for a Conditional Use Permit to authorize the construction of a new library within the interior campus of Northwest College.
- . The existing zoning in the area is Single Family Residential (RS 8.5), which allows the location of private schools on approval of a Conditional Use Permit. City of Kirkland Resolution No. 2163, which authorized the construction of married student housing, also authorized the entire college as a valid conditional use in this area.
- 3. The location of the proposed structure is within the boundaries of the original campus at approximately N.E. 55th and 111th Ave. N.E. The following are the existing college buildings in the irmediate surroundings:
- a. The Learning Center to the south.
 b. The Student Union Building to the southwest (see site plan)
- b. The Student Union building to the SouthWest (see Site plan) Approximate distances of the proposed library to the surrounding

perimeter of the college campus is from 400 to 750 feet.

- The Northwest College Master Plan indicated that a new building would need to be constructed which would require 15,150 square feet for the first phase. The Master Plan indicates this proposed building site was to be the future location of the library.
- 5. According to Northwest College's own Library Planning Program document, the Library is to be built in three phases, with the initial phase to total 14,976 square feet. The building will be approximately 70 by 100 feet and no more than 25 feet in height. Future construction phases will include three additions to the proposed library.
- 6. The existing library is presently being housed in the lower level of the chapel, and this has been the temporary location for the library. The existing library consists of only 6,425 square feet of space.
- 7. According to the Kirkland Zoning Ordinance, Section 23.34.020, colleges or universities require additional parking at a ratio not less than that of the following:
