RESOLUTION NO. R- 2754

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND ENDORSING IN PRINCIPLE THE EFFORT BY KING COUNTY TO DEVELOP A COUNTY-WIDE UNIFIED WEATHERIZATION PROGRAM TO PROVIDE WEATHER STRIPPING, INSULATION, CALKING AND STORM WINDOWS AT NO COST TO QUALIFIED LOW INCOME HOME OWNERS.

WHEREAS, King County, acting through its Office of Housing and Community Development Program, is seeking support for a proposed County-wide unified weatherization program to provide weather stripping, insulation, calking and storm windows at no cost to qualified low income home owners; and

WHEREAS, King County intends to request financial support and participation in such a program by way of application for HCD block grant funds, Department of Energy grant funds, and other possible sources; and

WHEREAS, the Land Use Policies Plan (Comprehensive Plan) for the City of Kirkland states that it is a policy of the City of Kirkland to maintain existing housing stock; and

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Kirkland believes that proper maintenance of existing housing stock is a viable method to provide housing for low and moderate income families; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Kirkland believes that the unified weatherization program, as proposed by King County, is consistent with the policy of the City of Kirkland as herein expressed, now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The Kirkland City Council endorses in principle the efforts of King County, acting through its Office of Housing and Community Development Program, to develop a unified weatherization program which will provide weather stripping, insulation, calking and storm windows at no cost to low income home owners County-wide, including King County's proposals for funding said program.
