## RESOLUTION NO. R- 2802

A RESOLUTION OF THE KIRKLAND CITY COUNCIL ACKNOWLEDGING THE AVAILABILITY OF ADDITIONAL HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT POPULATION FUNDS AND ALLOCATING THE SAME TO AN EXISTING 1980 PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the City of Kirkland has been advised by King County of additional population monies available to the City of Kirkland in the 1981 Housing and Community Development Planning and Management Grant as a result of the 1980 Federal Census Final Field Count; and

WHEREAS, said additional population monies may be allocated to any approved, existing housing and community development grant project; and

WHEREAS, after review of said program, it appears to the City Council that said additional population funds in the amount of \$2,683.00 should be made available to the 1980 CBD Street Crossings/Pedestrian Safety Improvements (CD-A109-80), now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The additional housing and community development block grant population monies available to the City of Kirkland as a result of the population increase, reflected by the 1980 Federal Census Final Field Count in the amount of \$2,683.00 is hereby allocated for use by the City of Kirkland in carrying out the 1980 Housing and Community Development project known as CBD Street Crossing/Pedestrian Safety Improvements (CD-A109-80).

Section 2. The allocation of additional population monies as made in Section 1 of this resolution shall be deemed to be in addition to any funds previously allocated and approved for said project.

Section 3. A certified or conformed copy of this resolution shall be delivered to the Housing and Community Development Program Office of King County by not later than February 18, 1981.
