

RESOLUTION NO. R-2926

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND APPROVING A JOINT ONE-YEAR HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT APPLICATION WITH KING COUNTY AND DECLARING SAID ONE-YEAR JOINT PROGRAM TO BE CONSISTENT WITH AND TO ADDRESS THE PROBLEMS IDENTIFIED IN THE 1983 KING COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT CONSORTIUM POLICY PLAN, AND TO ADDRESS THE PROBLEMS IDENTIFIED IN THE 3-YEAR HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PLAN HERETOFORE APPROVED ON SEPTEMBER 15, 1980, BY RESOLUTION NO. R-2756.

WHEREAS, the City of Kirkland jointly participates with King County in the application for funds pursuant to the Federal Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to that Act, the City may join with King County in requesting funds for a project to be administered jointly by the City of Kirkland and King County, and

WHEREAS, such joint program shall be consistent with and address the needs identified in the three-year plan heretofore approved by the Kirkland City Council on September 15, 1980, by Resolution No. R-2756, as well as the 1983 King County Community Development Block Grant Consortium Policy Plan,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The City Council hereby approves, after consideration and review, the joint project for acquisition of a senior housing site and related improvements for the period of July 1, 1983, through June 30, 1984, and finds and declares said plan to be consistent with and to address the problems identified in the three-year Housing and Community Development Plan adopted by the City of Kirkland by Resolution No. R-2756, and to be also consistent with the 1983 King County Community Development Block Grant Consortium Policy Plan. Both of said plans having been adopted pursuant to the requirements of the Federal Housing and Community Development Act of 1974.

Section 2. The one-year program plan herein approved and adopted consists of acquisition of a site for construction of a senior housing project to serve low and moderate income senior citizens, and any required or related on and off-site improvements necessary for completion of the project. The program may also include assistance to an eligible non-profit housing sponsor by supplying any seed money required by HUD in order to be eligible for Section 202 funding.

Section 3. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to sign on behalf of the City of Kirkland any and all documents, including agreements, which may be required in order to submit said plan and carry out the programs contained in said plan.
