

RESOLUTION R-3372

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO THE DEMOLITION OF WAVERLY HALL, THE PRESERVATION OF THE WAVERLY HALL MASONARY ENTRANCE ARCH AND TEMPORARY STORAGE THEREOF AT ITS EXISTING LOCATION, AND RESERVING A DECISION AS TO ITS PERMANENT LOCATION UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE MASTER PLAN FOR THE WAVERLY SITE IS COMPLETED AND APPROVED.

Whereas, the SEPA responsible official for the City of Kirkland has determined that there is some historical and social significance to the Waverly site, including Waverly Hall as a former high school and junior high school site; and

Whereas, the responsible official has further determined that the most reasonable mitigation of the impact of demolition of Waverly Hall is to retain and temporarily store the masonry arch entryway for Waverly Hall at its existing location; and

Whereas, the responsible official has determined that such retention and temporary storage shall be a mitigation condition of his SEPA declaration of non-significance with respect to issuance of a demolition permit for Waverly Hall; and

Whereas, the City Council believes that it is possible that the location designated for temporary storage of the masonry arch may not be the best location for permanent placement of the arch following completion of a master plan for the entire Waverly site and wishes to preserve the option of future relocation should this prove desirable; now, therefore,

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The Kirkland City Council accepts the determination of the SEPA responsible official and directs that the Waverly Hall masonry entrance arch (identified as alternate "C") be retained and temporarily stored in place.

Section 2. The City Council directs that master planning for the entire Waverly site shall include consideration of possible alternative sites for the masonry arch and recommendations therefore. The City Council reserves to itself a final decision for permanent siting of the masonry arch following completion of the master planning process for the entire Waverly site.
