A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND AUTHORIZING APPLICATIONS FOR FUNDING ASSISTANCE FOR AN OUTDOOR RECREATION PROJECT TO THE WASHINGTON STATE INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE FOR OUTDOOR RECREATION, AS PROVIDED BY THE MARINE RECREATION LAND ACT - 2ND STREET SOUTH DOCK FACILITY.

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Kirkland has approved the installation and construction of a marine pump-out station on the 2nd Street South Dock in the 1990 budget;

Whereas, under the provisions of the Marine Recreation Land Act state and federal funding assistance has been authorized and made available to aid in financing the cost of land for parks and the construction of outdoor recreational facilities of local public bodies; and

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Kirkland considers it in the best public interest to locate a public marine pump-out station at the 2nd Avenue South Dock, located in the City of Kirkland along the east shore of Lake Washington within Moss Bay; now, therefore

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Kirkland, Washington, that

- <u>Śection 1.</u> The City Manager is hereby authorized to make formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation for funding assistance.
- Section 2. Any fund assistance so received shall be used in the installation and construction of a public marine pump-out station on the 2nd Street South Dock on the eastern shore of Lake Washington within the City of Kirkland.
- Section 3. The City's share of the project will be derived from the City's adopted 1990 budget.
- Section 4. The City of Kirkland does hereby certify that the City is responsible to support all non-cash commitments to the local share should they not materialize.
- Section 5. Any property aquired with financial aid through the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, will be placed in use as an outdoor recreation facility

and be retained in such use in perpetuity unless as otherwise provided and agreed to by the City Council, the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation, and any affected federal agency.

<u>Section 6.</u> This resolution shall become part of a formal application to the Interagency Committee for Outdoor Recreation.

<u>Section 7.</u> Adequate notification has been given, an opportunity provided for public input, and published notices have identified affected flood plains and/or wetlands, if applicable.

Section 8. The City of Kirkland hereby certifies that the City is owner of the real property over which the 2nd Street South Dock lies and, based on current knowledge, provides assurance that there are no encumbrances on the land which would restrict recreation use as proposed in this application. The 2nd Street South Dock was built pursuant to a Street End Use Permit, which provides for public and private moorage.
