## RESOLUTION NO. R-\_3898\_

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND APPROVING THE JANUARY 1, 1995, THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 1995, HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM ESTABLISHING PRIORITIES AS TO AMOUNT OF FUNDS TO BE ALLOCATED EACH INDIVIDUAL PROGRAM AND THE SOURCE OF SAID FUNDS AND DECLARING SAID PROGRAM TO BE CONSISTENT WITH THE 1994 FUNDING GUIDELINES HERETOFORE APPROVED ON MAY 3, 1994, BY RESOLUTION NO. R-3874.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Federal Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, the City is required to develop and approve a program plan for the period commencing January 1, 1995, and ending December 31, 1995, which plan shall be consistent with and address the needs identified in the funding guidelines heretofore approved by the City Council by Resolution No. R-3874; and

WHEREAS, the City administration has developed and recommended such a program plan to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has received said program plan, held a public hearing thereon September 20, 1994, and approved said plan, now, therefore;

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The City Council hereby approves, after consideration and review, the program plan for the period of January 1, 1995, through December 31, 1995, and finds and declares said plan to be consistent with and to address the problems identified in the 1995 funding guidelines adopted for the City of Kirkland by Resolution No. R-3874, pursuant to the requirements of the Federal Housing and Community Development Act of 1974.

<u>Section 2.</u> The program herein approved and adopted consists of the following individual programs for which priority amount of Housing and Community Development funds are as set forth below:

## Section 3. Funding Contingency Plan

In the event there are reductions or increases on the federal level of amounts of Community Development Block Grant funding and, as a result thereof, the Block Grant funding allocation to the City of Kirkland is reduced or increased, then in that event, the amounts shall be distributed as follows:

Capital Project Allocation: If there is an increase or decrease in the capital project fund allocation, the additional or reduced amount shall be allocated or subtracted from housing development projects.

Planning and Administration Allocation: If there is an increase in Planning and Administration funds, the additional amount shall go toward the capital-housing development projects. If there is a decrease in funds, the amount shall be reduced from the administration portion of the planning and administration allocation.

Public Service Allocation: If there is a decrease in the funding amounts for public service funds, it shall be reduced from the Senior Center Wheelchair Lift project. If there is additional public service funds, it shall be equally divided among the KITH, YWCA, and EOC programs.

Section 4. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to sign on behalf of the City of Kirkland any and all documents, including agreements which may be required, in order to submit said plan and carry out the programs contained in said plan.
