

RESOLUTION R- 4028

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND APPROVING THE JANUARY 1, 1997, THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 1997, HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM ESTABLISHING THE AMOUNT OF FUNDS TO BE ALLOCATED EACH INDIVIDUAL PROGRAM AND DECLARING SAID PROGRAM TO BE CONSISTENT WITH THE 1996 FUNDING GUIDELINES HERETOFORE APPROVED ON APRIL 4, 1995, BY RESOLUTION NO. R-3928.

Whereas, pursuant to the Federal Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, the City is required to develop and approve a program plan for the period commencing January 1, 1997, and ending December 31, 1997, which plan shall be consistent with and address the needs identified in the funding guidelines heretofore approved by the City Council by Resolution No. R-3928; and

Whereas, the City administration has developed and recommended such a program plan to the City Council; and

Whereas, the City Council has received said program plan, held a public hearing thereon October 1, 1996, and approved said plan.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The City Council hereby approves, after consideration and review, the program plan for the period of January 1, 1997, through December 31, 1997, and finds and declares said plan to be consistent with and to address the problems identified in the applicable funding guidelines adopted for the City of Kirkland by Resolution No. R-3928, pursuant to the requirements of the Federal Housing and Community Development Act of 1974.

Section 2. The program herein approved and adopted consists of the following individual programs for which priority amount of Housing and Community Development funds are as set forth below:

### Section 3. Funding Contingency Plan

In the event there are reductions or increases on the federal level of amounts of Community Development Block Grant Funding and, as a result thereof, the Block Grant Funding allocation to the City of Kirkland is reduced or increased, then in that event, the amounts shall be distributed as follows:

*Capital Projects Allocation:* If there is an increase in the capital project fund allocation, the additional amount shall be allocated the Housing Development Set Aside for ARCH. If there is a decrease, the amount shall be decreased from the Public Works Department Handicap Accessibility Improvement project.


*Planning and Administration Allocation:* If there is an increase in Planning and Administration funds, the additional amount shall go toward the Housing Development Set Aside for ARCH. If there is a decrease, the amount shall be decreased from the Administration portion of the Planning and Administration Allocation.

*Public Service Allocation:* If there is a decrease in the funding amounts for public services funds, it shall be reduced equally from the KITH and EISCC project. However, in no case shall the amount of the program result in less than \$5,000. If there are additional public service funds it should be equally divided among the YWCA and EOC programs.


