

RESOLUTION 4241

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND AWARDING 2000 BUSINESS ASSOCIATION AND COMMUNITY EVENT GRANTS AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER GRANT PROGRAM AGREEMENTS

WHEREAS, during the 2000 budget process, the City Council approved and funded the Business Association and Community grant programs; and

WHEREAS, there is included in the 2000 City budget up to \$35,000 of ongoing funding and \$50,000 of one-time funding to be allocated for the aforementioned grant programs; and

WHEREAS, a review committee has made its recommendation to the City Manager, and the Council having reviewed same;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The report and the recommendation of the City Manager is accepted and approved by the City Council.

Section 2. Pursuant to and in order to carry out the 2000 Business Association and Community Event Grant Programs, the City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to enter into agreements on behalf of the City of Kirkland with the following designated organizations. The amounts of the 2000 grants are as follows:


